

Nations Notebook

- The students received information on Friday for their Nations Notebook project. We have begun the project in class and students have learned how to create their first bibliography card and start the first two pages of the booklet.
- Students who received responses from their embassies have received their packets which are in their writing folders. They are to keep this information at school
- 3. The students who did not receive

- information from their embassies ymay go online to the embassy webpage and print information from the site to bring to school.
- 4. The rough draft packet and the final booklet stays at school until permission is given from Mrs. Todd. This will be based on individual progress of each student.
- The student can use note cards to gather information outside of school.
- 6. All note taking MUST be the sole

work of the student.

- 7. If students receive excessive help from the parent, they will lose 25 points from the interim date grade and the final grade if there is no remedy after the discovery has been made.
- 8. Students will receive a daily nations notebook response sheet to give their parents so that the parents are aware of their progress and any needs that the student needs from the parent.

Interim Dates for the Nations Notebook Project- Please note bolded changes!

Interim Dates are the dates when students have to show me what they've accomplished and to check in and conference with me.

Students are evaluated daily- and weekly.

Every weekly due date is a quiz grade. If they are not prepared they will lose points.

Because of the snow we will not be doing notebooks daily but 1-2x/wk. They must be prepared to come work on those days. If not they earn a zero for that evaluation day.

Parents will receive their evaluation sheets every day we work on the project and students will receive a grade every day based on what they did that day. If they wasted time, you will know and if they were diligent in getting their work accomplished, you will know that also.

- ⇒ Please note,(*) this means the actual pages from the Notebook are due, Not rough drafts/ photocopy pages!
- Students will not get their actual notebook unless I have seen what they have written on note cards and in their rough draft.

T-shirt Book Report!

Just think of it. You have just read the best book! Now, you are trying to convince your friends, class-mates, family, everyone to read this amazing book! But how are you going to convince them...

make a shirt promoting the book! Using a plain T-shirt (any color or combination of colors) or on a T-shirt shaped piece of poster board, promote the book of your choice. (after getting it OK'd by Mrs. Todd).

Be sure to use fabric paint/glue, buttons, fabric scraps, ribbons, buttons, markers etc. be creative! The more creative the better the credit. If you only use markers your grade will be deducted. Use at least 3 kinds of things on your t-shirt

How to promote your book:

1. Choose an awesome book.

2. Read it

3. Choose an interesting illustration, character or incident that happens in your book.

4. On your shirt, include the following: The title, author, your chosen picture scene, a quote from the book and a catchy slogan that you make up.

- 5. Then prepare a short sales talk/ or commercial. Your presentation will be a 30 to 60 second television or radio commercial for the book you read. You will be timed. Practice your commercial to make sure of the timing. Use the following guidelines for writing the commercial:
- ⇒ Do not just encourage the audience by using opinion words (exciting, great, interesting, best, good, etc.), but also by featuring elements from the book – scenes, facts, etc.
- ⇒ Be dynamic. Try to convince the audience to buy the book whether you liked the book or not.



It will need to be written and handed in with your shirt. Please do this in your best handwriting!

6. Yes, you may wear the shirt, but I will be posting your shirt, so make sure you have a back up.

Stress Alert Project!



Congratulations! You have been chosen to be a reporter for your favorite news program. You have been asked to shoot on location near where a storm or disaster is taking place. Using p. 206 in Your Science Text book and p. 122 in your Science Activity Manual:

- 1. Choose your topic. Parents: students have no control over which topic they will receive. They will draw their topics 2/24/10
- 2. Research and record your information on your chosen topic on page 122 in your activity manual. Remember: reporters must answer the questions: who, what, when, where, why and how.
- 3. From the information that you've gathered and placed in your activity manual, organize your material into a news report for the evening news. Be creative! You may video your project if you choose. Bring in props or logos for your favorite news channel.
- 4. Don't go overboard! This is not a 30 minute news cast! You have only 2- 5 minutes to present. Don't get so caught up in the details of the presentation that you do not turn in a good product. This is a Science, History and Language Grade!
- 5. What you will turn in on 3/11/10:
- ⇒ a copy of your news report (so make sure you have 2– one for you to use and one for me to grade)
- ⇒ Your activity manual
- ⇒ Any CD's/DVD's that you've created to view.
- ⇒ Students DO NOT HAVE TO VIDEO TAPE THEIR NEWS PROGRAM. They can "shoot" their News show live, in the classroom. If you are planning to "shoot" live, **Do not bring your props etc. until the day that you are presenting** which you will receive on 3/11 and will be listed on the Tickler.
- 6. Parents **AVOID** the urge to help too much. You are not doing your child **ANY** favors. You actually **HURT** their grade when you are overly helpful!!!!!

Students will have time to work on their research in class after the during the week leading up to the due date. They must bring materials in class for them to work on.

Reminder: Project due Thursday March 11. Students will present on varying days. If the student is unprepared to present, their grade will be deducted.
