# 1. Student's boards will be situated according to their continents. They will each have a place where they will place their boards. There will be 4-6 boards per table.

- 2. What to bring:
- Your clothes representing your country. (You may come in wearing your outfit.)
- A change of comfortable clothes.
- Your board. (Mrs. Todd's class' boards will be kept in the classroom unless things need to be fixed).
- Your nation's notebook
- At least 4 dozen servings of your food/ drink to share with the school. You need to have your food in small
  cups or other sample cups. You may have some samples set aside for your classmates to try later in the day.
  Also, have napkins, toothpicks etc. This IS NOT a MEAL. The students will get a taste of your food.
- Any additional decorative items to from your country
- A bottle of water. You will get tired of speaking and your mouth will get dry,

Be Mindful Of Your Space: Students will only have about the space that they have at their desks. Please do not bring an excessive amount of items.

#### Be prepared to present:

Give a <u>short</u> summary (no more than 2 mins) about what your have learned about your country. You may use your display poster as a springboard. Some students in the past have pretended to be a flight attendant or a tour guide leading the students through their country.

You can be creative with an introduction! Students have spoken with accents from their country or even asked an introductory question in the language of their country. Some have also used quiet background music to enhance their presentation. Hopefully these ideas can help you as you plan on how to present your country.

### On World of Nation's Day:

- Arrive on time for school. Teachers will begin coming by at 9:00am.
- Set up and visit your classmates items.
- Be excited and engaging.
- Do NOT give food to any student before giving your presentation. Then they have to "pay" for it by ticket. If they have no more tickets, they may not have your sample.
- Groups will be visiting at 20 minute intervals. You will have 10 minute breaks in between each group

### The Display Poster for Nation Notebooks

- 1. Use a three-sided, free-standing backboard (available at teacher stores, business supply stores, Wal-Mart and craft stores such as Michael's).
- 2. Represent your country with pictures and information displayed in an artistic manner.
- 3. Label all pictures neatly. Students may type their labels for each picture on the computer and cut them out to put onto their poster. Students are to use an 18 font size if possible.
- 4. Mount pictures on construction paper making a border around them before placing them on the display board.
- 5. Use stencils, computer or pre-cut letters for your country's name.
- 6. Please have a border around the outside of your display board to have a finished look.
- 7. Be CREATIVE!!

The following items need to be displayed on your poster:

- A) Your nation's flag
- B) Your nation's motto
- C) Coat of Arms
- D) National Anthem
- E) Wildlife
- F) Places to visit
- G) Plant life
- H) Sports
- I) Money
- J) People

Please place your first and last name along with your teacher's name on a piece of paper. Place it the bottom right corner of the display board. Please use an18 font size.
