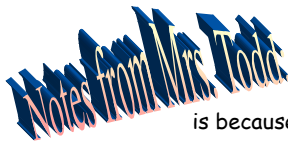


As you can see, students this week are tested or quizzed daily. This is because we are completing most

# 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Munching Minerals Project

## Part I

1. Choose a mineral from your textbook or other source by writing it on a correctly headed sheet of paper and turning it in.
2. Collect pictures of and information about the mineral of your choice. ( You may use the internet with parent approval)
3. Arrange collected materials neatly and attractively on a **standard** piece of poster board (half of the large board, **NO FOAM BOARDS! STUDENTS WILL LOSE POINTS**)

Include the following in your project: YOU MAY **NOT** TYPE THE INFORMATION ON YOUR BOARD (The title typed is acceptable, just not the research)

- ⇒ The name of the mineral
- ⇒ Pictures of mineral (if possible – I got these pictures from irocks.com)
- ⇒ Pictures of foods or beverages which your mineral is found
- ⇒ Ways that God designed our bodies to use this mineral
- ⇒ Display samples of food labels of products that contain your mineral.

This will be counted as a Quiz grade and I will be grading it according to the following criteria:

- ⇒ Were instructions followed?
- ⇒ Is the research thorough?
- ⇒ Is everything spelled correctly?
- ⇒ Is it well planned/ organized?
- ⇒ Is the project neat and visually appealing?
- ⇒ Is it the student's own work?

## Part II

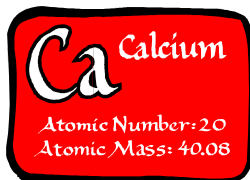
Students will give a 2 minute oral report on their chosen mineral.

1. Students will follow the instructions as given on page 188 of their Language Book
2. Students will speak for no less than 1.5 minutes and no more than 2.
3. Students will have an opportunity to answer questions about their chosen mineral from the student's in the class

This will be counted as a separate quiz grade for both Language and Science. I will be grading the oral report based upon the following criteria:

- ⇒ Instructions being followed
- ⇒ Content
- ⇒ Poise, Pronunciation and Volume
- ⇒ Answers to students questions
- ⇒ The student's own work
